

The Hurlers' March

"The Hurlers' March" is an Irish march in 2/4 time in D Major. The parts are played AAB. The hurler of the title is probably an athlete playing the Irish sport of hurling. It was printed in O'Neill's **Music of Ireland: 1850 Melodies** (1903) and Bancalafri's **Celtic Encyclopedia, Mandolin Edition** (1999).
