"Money in Both Pockets", in Gaelic, "*Airgiod Ann Gac Poca*" or "*Airgead in Gac Poca*" is also known as "Trip to Galloway". It is a Scottish jig known in Ireland, England and America.

The earliest printings of it can be found in the Scottish collections of Robert Petrie (1790) and Malcolm MacDonald's **A Third Collection of Strathspey Reels** (c. 1792).

It appears in this section because it appears in two of O'Neil's publications: **Music of Ireland: 1850 Melodies** (1903) and **Dance Music of Ireland: 1001 Gems** (1907). It has been printed by many others including Niel Gow.

It is not often recorded because many players consider it "an old chestnut" or too easy, even though it is a nice tune.
