

## O'Dwyer's Reel

"O'Dwyer's Reel", in Gaelic "*Seisd/Cor Ui Duibidir*", is an Irish reel in D major. The parts are played AB (O'Neill/1850 & 1001), AA'B (O'Neill/1915 & Krassen).

Some phrases are reminiscent of "The Devil's Dream". The first strain reappears as the 'A' part in Bayard's Pennsylvania-collected "Cheat River". Both this tune and that are related to "Soldier's Joy" and "Come Dance and Sing".

It was printed in O'Neill's **O'Neill's Irish Music** (1915), O'Neill (Krassen) (1976), O'Neill's **Music of Ireland: 1850 Melodies** (1903) and O'Neill's **Dance Music of Ireland: 1001 Gems** (1907).
